

### Flowing from the Inside Out

Jesus is noteworthy not shy about proclaiming the amazing abundance of God's love and healing for everybody everywhere. In our text last Sunday in John 7, Jesus stood up and shouted: "All who are thirsty should come to me! All who trust should drink. As the scriptures say: *Rivers of living water will flow out from within him.*"

There are two things I love about that short passage. One is that the scripture that Jesus quotes is nowhere to be found in the Old Testament as it now exists. As we have explored at EPC, the Bible is full of places where the abundant grace of God is compared to water or springs or rivers, but never in that exact phrasing. This means either Jesus knows of scripture that we don't, or he is so caught up in the moment that he's happy to make up new scripture on the spot. One of my closest friends at the Enneagram Prison Project (EPP) is Alex Senegal. Years ago, Alex was on the FBI's most-violent list. He had so lost contact with his own holy self that he came to believe that gangs and drugs and violence offered his best chance at survival. After years of incarceration Alex rediscovered himself through his own willingness and the compassionate work of the Enneagram and EPP. Alex is now an Ambassador and board member at EPP, an ordained pastor at a church in San Francisco, and he has often said to me, "Phil, the river of life flows from the inside out." I want you to think about that for a moment. Jesus in his exuberance and Alex in his hard-earned wisdom are telling us that the river of life is not something we need to go hunting for, over some distant horizon. The river of life is flowing from inside of us into the world at every moment. No searching involved; only acceptance and trust. God's river does not run dry, ever.

The second thing I love is what I mentioned at first: Jesus' pure trust. For Jesus, God's grace and love are so present and so big and so good that there is plenty for everyone. All the thirsty everywhere, come on in. All the hurting people, come on over. Me, little old me? Yes, me too. Stand up and shout, because the water is refreshing and real and there is more than enough.
