

### Ch-ch-changes (with a nod to David Bowie)



In Genesis 12, God asks Abraham to leave his land and his family to go to a new land that God will show him. God suggests that God will bless Abraham so abundantly that he will become a blessing to “all the families of the earth.” The text then says, “Abraham left just as the Lord told him. Let’s reflect briefly on some nuggets of life wisdom in this simple text.

- **Change is inevitable.** In the David Bowie song referenced in the title, Bowie sings, “*Ch-ch-changes, pretty soon now you’re gonna get older. Time may change me, but I can’t trace time.*” Most of the time, we get amazingly little input on the changes that happen to us. What we do get to decide is how much we trust. Abraham trusted God and moved. That act of trust changed history. Change may be inevitable, but trust is optional. Am I willing to trust God to guide me through the changes I’m facing right now?
- **God blesses us so that we might be a blessing to others.** Two simple questions: 1) Am I noticing how much I am being blessed today, and 2) Do I allow these blessings to flow through me and bless the people around me? God will bless the world with or without my participation. But entering God’s cycle of blessings makes life so much yummier.
- This whole story in Genesis happens when Abraham is **75 years old**. God doesn’t say, “Abe, you have lived a long and faithful life. Good job, now take it easy.” Where we see retirement, God sees possibility. Where we see aging and slowing down, God sees blessings multiplying. Where we see dying, God sees new life.

Here’s a little exercise to do. Try finishing these sentences. You could even write down your answers.

1. I’m too old to...
2. Edgcumbe Church is too small to...
3. Our society is too messed up to...

Take a moment to look at your answers. Notice what you are feeling in your heart.

Now switch those same prompts around to something like this (feel free to let the Spirit guide your mind to new questions or prayers...):

- A. God, I want you to bless me so that I can be a blessing to others.
- B. Jesus, who do you want me to invite to Edgcumbe church this week? (Or: Jesus, exciting things do envision for our community and what is your assignment to me to help make it happen?)
- C. Spirit, show me how you are blessing every family on the earth right now.

Take another moment to repeat these simple prayers and invitations. Now what are you feeling in your heart? This simple reframing is exactly what Abraham did and what the Spirit offers to us with every change we experience.

*Holy Spirit, you be in charge, and we will follow you,  
trusting that your direction leads to peace!!*

The June mission is Plaster House where the Eggerts volunteered for 7 years, Ingrid as a teacher and Ron as a doctor. Plaster House provides outreach, preoperative care, surgery and postoperative care and rehabilitation for children with cleft lip/palate, hydrocephalus, spina bifida, skeletal fluorosis, club foot, burn scar contracture and osteomyelitis.
