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<u>Losing My Life to Save My Life</u>

In Mark 8, Jesus says, "All who want to save their lives will lose them." Or, in Phil's translation: "All who want to save their sense of self must lose their sense of self." What? This is hard to fathom. How does one lose something in order to gain it?

In order to understand this spiritual paradox, last Sunday we used the Social Roles for the Enneagram Types. Here they are again.

T8 The Rock - "I'm tough. I'm the one everyone else has to depend on."

T9 Nobody Special - "Don't buy me a birthday present, I know you love me."

T1 The Educator - "I know how things should be done."

T2 The Special Friend - "Isn't it wonderful how close we are?"

T3 The Best - "I can do this better than anyone else."

T4 The Special One - "No one understands me."

T5 The Expert - "I know what I am talking about."

T6 The Stalwart - "You can depend on me."

T7 The Energizer - "Come on everybody! Let's get some juice going."

In worship we asked each other the question: What is a way that you are (the Rock,
the Expert, the Energizer), using whatever role feels most alive for you in the mome	nt. You
could do this exercise again with someone in your household or with a friend or jour	naling on
your own. The follow-up question is this, "Who am I if I am not (the Educa	tor, the
Special Friend, the Best)?", using whichever role you chose for the first question. I	want you to
stop reading this article and ask yourself this question right now, if you are willing.	

Because I chose "The Rock," then I ask myself, "Who am I if I am not the Rock?" The first thing that happens for me is I get a sinking feeling in my guts. I don't want to give up this sense of myself. I am most comfortable as The Rock. Then I re-hear Jesus' words that I cannot save my life unless I give up my sense of myself. Oof. So I try again. Who am I if I am not The Rock? Here is what comes to me in this moment. If I am not The Rock...

- I am lost and uncertain about who I am supposed to be
- I can set down a lifetime of expectations and responsibilities and burdens
- I can use my gifts and life energy in a variety of ways; I can live in freedom

- I am simply Phil, full of light and love and endless possibility
- I am a Divine Spark, a child of God, a free agent of goodness
- I am free, I am loved, I am innocent

Do you see how easy—and how hard—this is? That took me two minutes, and I'm a little shaky inside from the power of it. Grab a pen and piece of paper and give this exercise a try. All we are doing is making some space for the love of Jesus and power of the Holy Spirit to do their healing work in our hearts. Phil

Holy Spirit, in this holy moment, **you** be in charge, and we will follow **you**, trusting that your direction will lead us to peace!!

<u> March Mission: Minnesota FoodShare</u>

This month Edgcumbe is collecting funds for the Foodshare Campaign that supports multiple Minnesota food pantries. We are also continuing our support of nearby pantry Francis Basket. Our own food shelf at Edgcumbe gives extra items to this pantry located in the apartment complex across the street from Sibley Plaza on 7th Street.

The Greater Minnesota Council of Churches FoodShare began its work in 1982 as a campaign advanced by congregations to restock food shelves in the 7-county Twin Cities Metropolitan Area. Minnesota FoodShare March Campaign, is the largest grassroots food and fund drive in the state, bringing together organizations, businesses, faith communities, and individuals to help stock and support the capacity of nearly 300 food shelves. Here are some facts about food insecurity in Minnesota:



- Minnesotans made a record-breaking 7.5 million visits to food shelves in 2023. This is up 36.4% from the previous record of 5.5 million visits in 2023, and up 102% from 3.7 million visits in 2014.
- Annual visits to food shelves are now more than double the rates of pre-pandemic visits.
