<u>Rest in Peace, Todd Barnes</u>

Todd died a little after 2pm this past Sunday, after the organ donor honor ceremony at the hospital and the prayers of Edgcumbe Church and so many others. We commend Todd's body and soul to God–which means that we both say Goodbye to Todd and we trust in the eternal love of God that connects us together beyond life or death.

We spent a good part of our worship service talking about Todd and we will continue to do so over the coming weeks and months. I wonder if many of the people who were at the hospital last Sunday will visit Edgcumbe's worship this coming week—so prepare for EPC Todd Memorial #2. Giving ourselves and the community places to celebrate and grieve and process and trust is a core part of what we do as the Body of Christ.

The official memorial service for Todd is still scheduled for the afternoon of Saturday, May 11, in the EPC Backwoods. Stay tuned for more details.

<u> Church Inside Workday - This Saturday!</u>

To prepare for our Clothing Exchange & Pie Social in early May, we are planning an indoor workday on Saturday, April 13, from 1-4pm. Some of our goals include: cleaning and organizing the church office and Rooms 1 & 2 upstairs, and doing Spring cleaning in the sanctuary, narthex, and parlor. While we have some cleaning supplies at church, please feel free to bring your own–good vacuums are especially helpful.

<u> April Mission: an update</u>

The Mission Team was originally working with Todd Barnes as April's focus to support his work with youth through the Deconstruction Zone project. **sigh** We have decided that we want to still have a mission focus at some point on this work, but have discerned that we will wait and reach out to his colleague, Lewiee Blaze, after a period of time when this work resumes.

Meanwhile, while having conversation with Highland Park High School to learn about ways to support mental health wellbeing for youth, we received word about a May focus at the highschool. The Mental Health team of HPHS would like to provide activities during the month of May, which is National Mental Health Awareness Month. They want to focus on completing activities for both staff and students to bring more awareness, decrease stigma and increase knowledge of mental health and mental health supports. Some ideas that the team have thought of but are limited by funding include: therapy animals/Paws for Healing, affirmation steamers, aromatherapy or self-care packs, and in-building staff yoga or mini massage therapy sessions. The Mission monies raised in April will be given to the Mental Health Team of HPHS for their May activities. <u>Exam proctors needed for Highland Park Sr High School</u>

Here's another great opportunity to support our High School Neighbors. Volunteer proctors are needed for the upcoming IB (International Baccalaureate) DP (Diploma Programme) Exams. Exam dates are from April 25 through May 15. We (as well as others from EPC) volunteered for this last year. All testing is done at the High School (next door to EPC). Each Exam session is

from 3 to 3.5 hours long (either the morning or the afternoon). The proctor's tasks are to 1) help set up the room for testing, 2) walk around the room during the test to make sure students are following the rules, and 3) accompany students to and from the rest room areas. You do not need to know anything about the subject matter of the exams to be a proctor. Please consider signing up for one or more time slots. Sign up instructions are below.
