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<u> Maundy Thursday Potluck & Worship</u> 6pm

We are fully aware that Maundy is a weird word. It comes from the Latin for "mandate" - commandment, because on the Thursday passover meal before his arrest, Jesus gives the disciples his great commandment to love one another as he has loved them. Each Spring at Edgcumbe Church, we regather to remember and to eat and sing and pray together.



So tomorrow, April 17, we will have a potluck meal and worship in the church sanctuary, starting at 6:00pm. If this is your first Maundy Thursday at EPC, here's what you need to know.

- Everybody is welcome: children, guests, even you.
- We will gather at tables set up in the sanctuary to eat at 6pm, with worship following around 6:30pm. Come any time you can make it. We should be done around 7:15pm. If we run out of tables, we will sit in the pews. Let's fill the place up.
- What food should you bring to share? Anything–it's a potluck. We don't have any Lenten food rules here, so sweets or main dishes or veggies or salad or fruit or bagels or drinks, homemade or store-bought, are all welcome. If you don't have any food to share–PLEASE COME ANYWAY. We really mean it.
- The church has plates and bowls and cups and napkins. If you are bringing a dish that needs a spatula or spoon or hot pad for serving, it can be helpful if you bring that too, but we do have some serving implements. We even have an oven if you need to heat something up.
- Feel free to come early to hang out and help set up or stay late to hang out and clean up. Don't forget to invite a friend.

"Easter" is also an interesting word. It means what it says: "east" or "dawn." It is the reminder that God's love and mercy are as faithful as the sun dawning each day in the east, without fail; that life comes after death just as predictably as light follows darkness every single day. Are you ready for the dawning of a new day, a new you, a new world? Then join us this coming Sunday, April 20 at 10am. We gather again in the hope of resurrection, in the joy of singing together, in the perfume of colorful mums, and in the embrace of God's love to set aside our ancient fears and remember together Who We Are!

<u>Forgiveness</u>

As we have been practicing forgiveness together these past six weeks, I have begun to hear certain words from the congregation. Words and feelings like, "release" or "hope" or "freedom" or "unexpected joy" or "I don't understand what's happening, but I know I feel better" or, somewhat confusingly, "chocolate."

The point of forgiveness is not to get you to do something you don't want to do. The point of forgiveness is to open the space inside of you to experience real joy and freedom and maybe even chocolate (as a metaphor for decadent yumminess, perhaps?). So feel free to proclaim boldly:

God is the love in which I forgive.


