<u>epc sayings, part 2</u>

as phil mentioned last week, it is interesting to note the phrases which weave together this tapestry named edgcumbe presbyterian. with your help, i have a some more common phrases which are shared around epc to add this week:

- take a breath (thanks, rachel!)
- expect miracles
- surrender
- when we come to the end of ourselves, that is when life begins
- forgiveness is accepting our at*one*ment, which re-minds us that we have always been at*one with god (and our true/holy selves)
- everything is for forgiveness
- god is absolute love-so absolute, there is no opposite
- i want the peace of god
- we belong to each other
- come into the present moment

i want to remind us of the phrases that phil brought last week:

- God is the love in which I forgive.
- Now-change-trust: God's kingdom is right now; I am willing to change my heart and mind; I chose trust. *(from Mark 1)*

- My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you. (from John 15)
- The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, trust, gentleness, and self-control. Against such things there is no law. *(from Galatians 5)*
- Everything is either an expression of love or a call for love. Everything.
- I don't need love; I am love.
- The opposite of love is fear.
- It is for freedom that Christ set us free. (again Galatians 5)
- Deep calls to deep. (from Psalm 42)
- Holy Spirit, in this holy moment, you be in charge, and we will follow you, trusting that your direction leads to peace.

these phrases that we return to are guiding us in remembering that these lives of ours *matter*. and our minds become the filter from which we see the world, others, ourselves, and even god. jesus came not to "save our souls," but **to heal our minds**. this is referred to from our scripture text from this past sunday:

christ has set us free for freedom. therefore, stand firm and don't submit to the bondage of slavery again.

it is a part of the human condition that we get caught up and lost to fear, guilt, shame, resentments. we unconsciously fall into habits which seek power and control, safety and security, and affection and connection. but when we come from these habitual mindsets, when we look to external circumstances to "save" us, **we are actually in bondage**. and we are addicted to the thoughts and habits.

what twelve step wisdom tells us is that before anything, we have to be willing to see the ways we are caught in cycles of death and are in bondage. fear and shame (or any of the things previously mentioned) are killing us....while our bodies are still standing upright. we get to be brave by coming to the end of our selves.... and knowing we can fix ourselves. we can surrender. and when we come to the end of ourselves, life begins. we surrender our wills and our lives into the care of the holy spirit.

it is for freedom that christ sets us free. i invite you, in this moment, to *breathe*, and to pause and ask holy spirit to show you where you are caught in bondage in these days. are you willing to see and know those addictions where you are in bondage??

look again at the listing of epc phrases. are any of these particularly intersecting with where you are in this moment? write it down and keep it close. i literally wrote prayer phrases on my palm for a couple of years straight–because i knew of my propensity to forget. but i invite you to return to these ideas, and then return again when you forget.

we are walking each other into freedom!! yay, holy spirit!! 😚

In the serene setting of the Wayzata Big Woods, our mission of the month (The Retreat) provides a residential program of immersion in the 12 Steps of AA. For over 35 years, The Retreat has provided a continuum of innovative, affordable services to alcohol and drug-dependent individuals and their families. Within the healing setting of the Big Woods (a setting



reminiscent of EPC's own Backwoods), guests learn the benefit of prayer, meditation, and quiet reflection, as they begin new lives of recovery.

Through a non-clinical, mutual-help approach, The Retreat provides services at a significantly lower cost than other programs. However, scholarships are crucial for many people in need of services. 
