Spiritual Seeing

Today we remember a basic law of spiritual seeing: *We will look upon that which we feel within*. If hatred finds a foothold in our hearts, then we will perceive a fearful world. If we feel the love of God within ourselves, then we will see a world of mercy and joy and love. The moment that we truly understand and follow this spiritual law is the moment that the healing of the world begins.

This is exactly how Jesus lived. Jesus never forgot that he was one with God and everyone else, and this meant that Jesus was plugged into the light and power and love of the universe. In Matthew 5, in the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus says, 'You have heard it said, "Love your neighbors and hate those who persecute you." But I say to you, Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you.' Jesus also said–while hanging from the cross!--'Father, forgive them for they know not what they do.' Following Jesus does not mean being slightly nicer to the

people around you (which is still a great idea, by the way). Following Jesus means first loving and then praying diligently for our enemies. It means bringing complete forgiveness to every situation. It means never forgetting who and whose we are.

Are you feeling bummed about division or hatred or violence in the world? Here is another saying that Luna and I often come to:

• If I want the world to be different; I need to be different. If we want the world to change, we need to change.

Following Jesus' example, today we find the courage to change, to be different, to love our enemies, to pray for those who persecute us, to forgive everybody for everything.

Galatians 5:1 reminds us that "**Christ has set us free for freedom.**" The freedom to live in love and joy and peace is already mine. How do I want to use that freedom today? Hope to see you at the bowling lanes! -Phil

In the serene setting of the Wayzata Big Woods, our mission of the month (The Retreat) provides a residential program of immersion in the 12 Steps of AA. For over 35 years, The Retreat has provided a continuum of innovative, affordable services to alcohol and drug-dependent individuals and their families. Within the healing setting of the Big Woods (a setting



reminiscent of EPC's own Backwoods), guests learn the benefit of prayer, meditation, and quiet reflection, as they begin new lives of recovery.

Through a non-clinical, mutual-help approach, The Retreat provides services at a significantly lower cost than other programs. However, scholarships are crucial for many people in need of services.
