paul re-minds us that we are not these bodies we see, we are not these stories of ours, we are not even our worries, shame and fears. we are spirit, beloved and holy, incorruptible. and because of that, we already have the fruit of the spirit manifested within us. truer than what you see in the mirror, you have love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, trust, gentleness and self-control within you!! you do not need to earn these, or study theology, or even go to therapy to have these resonances of spirit. they are who you are in truth...many traditions would call this your holy (or true) self.

meister eckhart, the late 13th and early 14th century christian mystic, wrote, "god is not found in the soul by adding anything, but by a process of subtraction." the soul doesn't grow into god by adding more, but by taking away that which stands in the way. the way of freedom is by surrendering and consent. we allow our minds to be healed so that we can come into our right mind, which is the holy spirit. and then she allows an entirely new operating system to run–of freedom and joy–which allows us to meet the world now as a healer, extending what was first received by us.

you are light. you are love. what fruit of the spirit feels especially juicy to you right now?? as your pastor, i invite you to bring that into your daily prayers and ask the holy spirit to live in you.

i see you, be-ing of light and love!! and i join in the dance with you!!

For over 35 years, The Retreat has provided a continuum of innovative, affordable services to alcohol and drug-dependent individuals and their families. Within the healing setting of the Big Woods (a setting



reminiscent of EPC's own Backwoods), guests learn the benefit of prayer, meditation, and quiet reflection, as they begin new lives of recovery.

Through a non-clinical, mutual-help approach, The Retreat provides services at a significantly lower cost than other programs. However, scholarships are crucial for many people in need of services.
