Living Christ! We do not yet know what funeral arrangements might be made by the family, but we will have a time of remembrance and celebration for Liz during worship this Sunday.

We focus on vegetables, fruits, and nutrient rich breads because hunger relief organizations often find it challenging to consistently provide fresh food options for their clients. We seek to improve food insecure individuals' access to fresh, nutritious food.
