What's My Job

One of the most radical ideas in the Bible is that our basic worth as a human being does not rest within myself but in the heart and mind of God. Therefore:

- It's not my job to either earn or evaluate my own worth.
- It's not my job to judge other people's worth.
- It's not my job to fear what will happen when I falsely perceive that my worth is not up to par or feels threatened

God has already determined my worth-and God calls me good, calls me God's child, calls me Beloved. My worth is not up for debate. My worth is not vulnerable to attack or deterioration. My worth is both invulnerable and indestructible exactly because it lies in the heart and mind of God.

It's not my job to prove or disprove what God calls me. My job is to accept; my job is to become willing; my job is to trust. My job is to accept God's grace and then give it away. Because it is in giving that we receive. This is the crazy, radical, and life-changing mathematics of the gospel.

The mission team is excited to share that our mission for November is The Lift Garage, which offers people a vehicle out of poverty through low-cost car repairs. You will want to be in worship on Sunday, November 9th, when Lift Founder and Executive Director Cathy Heying will join us. Years as a social worker opened her eyes to the over-sized influence of bad cars on the lives of low income

people. When she heard God's call to do something about it, the story of The Lift began.

Since 2012, The Lift has been creating more secure lives for low-income Minnesotans through low-cost repairs, free pre-purchase inspections of used cars, and connections to other community partners to help meet customers' holistic needs.
