### reflections on the beloved community which is epc

i have been asking holy spirit what to share in this week's email... and in my prayers this morning, i kept coming back to the astounding gifts which surround me. so let me tell you a bit about the gift that is specifically the beloved community at edgcumbe presbyterian. as some of you might know, phil and i began serving epc august 1, 2007–18 years ago! and i could say plenty about the different chapters of the life of the community over that time, but mostly i want to reflect on the body in these days, edgcumbe has always been amazing, but in these days the community feels *extraordinary* to me....like, magical, grace-filled, open hearted, grounded. and yes, that is the holy spirit's presence among us, but it is lived out through each of our lives. each of you contributes to the spirit (and vibe) of the community, and it super demonstrates that we are not only just learning about trust, we are all living into trust-for god, each other, and even ourselves!! one of the visitors from this past sunday joined us for her 2nd time, and she mentioned that she is still talking to people about her first experience of the community. she said she has never felt such a palpable experience of love as she has with the edgcumbe community. to me that was one of the highest praises any church could receive-it means that god's only-loveness is being translated and extended by our lives. this, my friends, means that the healing of our minds from fear and separation (and guilt, resentment, falseness, etc) is occurring. together, we are a new creation!!

even though i did not personally grow up presbyterian, what i have come to love about the bones of this larger body is the belief and practices which recognize that the pastors are never solely in charge. our church structure ordains elders from within the community to be serving alongside the pastors in the stewardship of the church. our community is blessed to have 4 amazing folks serving as ruling elders currently: ingrid e, la gretta l, chelsea w, and jay mcg. in addition to that, also amazing are the gifts and presence which each of you weave into the body. i really encourage each of you to be brave and awkward (maybe it's just me who is awkward?!?!??) and connecting with each person who comes into our circle. maybe while phil and i are away, it could be the excuse to talk to a couple of people that you don't know very well. and even connecting beyond a sunday! i also encourage you to keep your eyes open to visitors...pretty much any person who shows up has been nudged by spirit....there is a gift to be received with each story.

mostly, i want you all to know that you have shaped me and brought so much healing into my own life. as spirit keeps nudging me into new and unexpected directions, you all have extended so much grace and excitement for me....and this has been such an extraordinary gift. and as i deepen into the freedom of at\*one\*ment with god/myself/others, here is what i am being invited into during this australian adventure:

- presence (to breath, feel my feel on the ground)
- to be open-hearted (knowing that everything is for my healing)
- curious (softening defenses and trusting)
- delighted (connecting to gratitude)

thank you for working alongside your elders tending to the community in these next weeks. i absolutely entrust you all into holy spirit's care! and like the apostle paul, i give thanks each time i think of you!! i carry you in my heart!! joy to you!! pastor luna 6

holy spirit, you be in charge, and we will follow you, trusting that your way leads to peace.

Those of you in church on November 9 th heard the inspiring story of The Lift Garage, including the faith journey of Founder/Executive Director Cathy Heying. As a social worker, she noticed the out-sized influence of bad cars on the lives of low income people. Over time, she heard God's call to do something about it, and – after much discernment – she followed the call.

Since 2012, The Lift has been creating more secure lives for low-income Minnesotans through low-cost repairs, free pre-purchase inspections of used cars, and connections to other community partners to help meet customers' holistic needs.
